Goldilocks and the Three Bears

Ladybirds have been learning the story of Goldilocks and what happens when she goes to the house of the Three Bears. As part of their learning, they visited our forest trail to help Goldilocks and the Three bears. This helped the children remember the names of the story characters, learn new vocabulary from the story as well as beginning to develop their understanding of positional language. This was the nursery children's first visit to the newly renovated forest trail and the children can't wait to go back soon!



Labelling School Uniform and Coats

With over 200 children wearing school jumpers and the only way of distinguishing them is their size, you can perhaps understand **the importance of making sure your child's school sweatshirt has a name label**. At the end of the school day, children are given time to collect their belongings from the coat hook or the box in the classroom where they can put their sweatshirt if they are too warm.

At school collection time, the school staff are focused on making sure that all the children are collected safely. If your child has forgotten something, it is not always possible for a member of staff to leave the playground or classroom to look for it. **If an item of clothing, a bookbag or water bottle has been lost, then it can be found and reunited with its owner the next day, provided it has been labelled with a child's name**. Don't forget that this includes lunchboxes, coats, hats, scarfs, wellies and gloves. Your help with this would be really appreciated. You can help your child, by teaching them to look after their belongings – **please don't get cross with the adults** as I am sure you can imagine it is quite a feat to organise 30 children!

Getting ready for the autumn weather

Talking of coats, please ensure that your child has a warm coat with a hood and sturdy shoes to wear to school as the weather starts to get colder and wetter. The children spend time playing outdoors every day and if they walk to school, it will be very uncomfortable for them if their school uniform is wet. We may have to phone you to ask you to bring in some spare clothes which might be difficult if you are at work. The local community shop might have some second-hand children's winter coats in stock so that is worth a look.

Flu Immunisations

Children, whose parents returned the permission form, had their flu immunisation today. We will let you know if the Flu Immunisation Service is running additional clinics, so you can book an appointment if you would now like your child to have their flu immunisation another time.

Most of these events are free and unless otherwise stated, you can just turn up and join in. The whole activity Calendar for the Moorlands Family Centre will be sent separately.


